#### Invocation

#### \*Invocation

Almighty King, Incarnate Word, Holy Comforter, Great One in Three, we do not come this morning to worship a generic deity or life force, a philosopher's god, or a mere unmoved mover, but the One True God who created heaven and earth from the overflow of love among three persons in joyful fellowship who desired to make creatures in their own image to reflect their glory and with whom to fellowship. For the sake of the Son who bound himself to us that we might be bound to you, please receive our worship this morning and purify it by your Spirit. Blessed are you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, One God, world without end. Amen.

#### Call to Confession

Matthew 6.19-21

LEADER: Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves

break in and steal,

PEOPLE: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal.

LEADER: For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

#### Corporate Confession of Sin

O eternal God and merciful Father, we humble ourselves before You, against Whom we have frequently and grievously sinned. We acknowledge our waywardness, and are truly sorry for all our sins.

Nevertheless, O Lord God and gracious Father, we know that You do not desire the death of the sinner, but rather that he should turn to You and live. Wash us in the pure fountain of Jesus' blood, so that we may become clean and white as snow.

#### Call to Confession

As we worship God we cannot help but see how we have fallen short of His glory. His Holy Scripture reveals this to us and points our hearts towards confession.

#### Corporate Confession of Sin

We sin in thought, word, and deed every week. Our prayer includes time for silent confession, but also confession as a family of individuals equally in need of God's grace.

# Assurance of Pardon

God's Holy Scripture reminds us not only of who we are as sinners, but also assures us of who we are as Christians united to Jesus in His death and resurrection.

#### Scripture Lesson

We hear Holy Scripture throughout our time in worship, but this lesson (reading), prepares us for the lesson of the sermon. Inscribe Your law upon the tablets of our hearts. And give us the desire and strength to walk in Your ways. Amen.

#### Assurance of Pardon

#### God Consecrates Us

#### Scripture Lesson

Jonah 3.1-10

<sup>1</sup> Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah the second time, saying, <sup>2</sup> "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it the message that I tell you." <sup>3</sup> So Jonah arose and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly great city, three days' journey in breadth. <sup>4</sup> Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's journey. And he called out, "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" <sup>5</sup> And the people of Nineveh believed God. They called for a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least of them.

<sup>6</sup> The word reached the king of Nineveh, and he arose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. <sup>7</sup> And he issued a proclamation and published through Nineveh, "By the decree of the king and his nobles: Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste anything. Let them not feed or

drink water, <sup>8</sup> but let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and let them call out mightily to God. Let everyone turn from his evil way and from the violence that is in his hands. <sup>9</sup> Who knows? God may turn and relent and turn from his fierce anger, so that we may not perish."

<sup>10</sup> When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil way, God relented of the disaster that he had said he would do to them, and he did not do it.

LEADER: This is the Word of the Lord.

PEOPLE: Thanks be to God.

## Prayer of the Church

#### Doxology

A *doxology* is a hymn or word of praise to God for His goodness and glory.

#### Scripture Lesson

We hear and read Holy Scripture through the service, but this lesson (reading) guides the sermon.

#### Sermon

A preacher is commanded to faithfully steward God's Holy Scripture by submitting to it, studying it, and expositing it (holding it forth), bearing witness to Jesus, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

#### Scripture Lesson

Mark 8.1-10

No. 733

<sup>1</sup> In those days, when again a great crowd had gathered, and they had nothing to eat, he called his disciples to him and said to them, <sup>2</sup> "I have compassion on the crowd, because they have been with me now three days and have nothing to eat. <sup>3</sup> And if I send them away hungry to their homes, they will faint on the way. And some of them have come from far away." <sup>4</sup> And his disciples answered him, "How can one feed these people with bread here in this desolate place?" 5 And he asked them, "How many loaves do you have?" They said, "Seven." 6 And he directed the crowd to sit down on the ground. And he took the seven loaves, and having given thanks, he broke them and gave them to his disciples to set before the people; and they set them before the crowd. <sup>7</sup> And they had a few small fish. And having blessed them, he said that these also should be set before them. 8 And they ate and were satisfied. And they took up the broken pieces left over, seven baskets full. <sup>9</sup> And there were about four thousand people. And he sent them away. 10 And immediately he got into the boat with his disciples and went to the district of Dalmanutha.


