Call to Confession



Scripture Lesson

Hebrews 12.18-29 (p. 1009)

¹⁸ For you have not come to what may be touched, a blazing fire and darkness and gloom and a tempest ¹⁹ and the sound of a trumpet and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that no further messages be spoken to them. ²⁰ For they could not endure the order that was given, "If even a beast touches the mountain, it shall be stoned." ²¹ Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, "I tremble with fear." ²² But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, ²³ and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, ²⁴ and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the spirikled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.

²⁵ See that you do not refuse him who is speaking. For if they did not escape when they refused him who warned them on earth, much less will we escape if we reject him who warns from heaven. ²⁶ At that time his voice shook the earth, but now he has promised, "Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heavens." ²⁷ This phrase, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of things that are shaken—that is, things that have been made—in order that the things that cannot be shaken may remain. ²⁸ Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, ²⁹ for our God is a consuming fire.

UPDATE FROM CPC MISSIONARIES IN GERMANY



David & Eowyn Stoddard

David & Eowyn Stoddard and their five children are serving with MTW in Berlin, Germany as church planters. They hold monthly brunches for their non-Christian friends, and David gives an evangelistic devotional. Eowyn has a group of young women who meet together regularly called Mama Talk, giving her opportunity to make friends with these young mothers, share scripture, and pray for their needs. Both of these venues give the Stoddards the opportunity to invite unbelievers to their church.

David is also involved in the education of church leaders in Germany through a new Reformed Seminary called the Martin Bucer Seminary. Just before the outbreak of war in Ukraine, he went to Odessa to meet missionaries and partners in ministry.

Please pray for them and their ministry in these particular ways:

- The Stoddards have started teaching a small group focused on biblical theology. It's been a joy to teach new and old believers how to read the Scriptures as one story, to marvel at the beauty of God's mission through Christ, and look forward to how the story resolves. Pray our teaching encourages and strengthens the believers. Pray it teaches them a new way to read and ponder Scripture.
- All MTW missionaries in Europe will gather for a once-every-four-years Area Retreat. Our plenary speaker is one of our German partners from Munich. David will also be preaching during the Sunday worship. The focus is on care and respite. Many of our missionaries are hurting and wounded. Some are being displaced through the Ukraine crisis. Pray the speaking and teaching points them God's sovereign comfort and care.
- David has also started coaching 5 leaders and church-planters. This has become one of his greatest joys and strategic opportunities. He's also coaching a missionary team leader who wants his team to be more effective in outreach and church-planting. All these are exciting places to have influence. Pray that the Lord gives David wisdom, discernment, boldness and insight. Pray these meetings strengthen church-planters and bear fruit in the lives of their churches.
