Assurance of Pardon

Holy Scripture assures Christians, sinners saved by grace, that they are united to Jesus in His death and resurrection.

Scripture Lesson

Doxology

Prayer of the Church

The language spoken is called Dazaga, and nearly all these people are Muslim. There have been few efforts at church planting among the Daza, but Josiah and Miriam joined MTW in a desire to translate the Bible for the Daza.

CPC MISSIONARIES IN REYNOSA, MEXICO

Mario and Keila Xoca married in 1996. From 2007-2016, Mario was an IT manager and overseer of four local plants for an automotive company in Reynosa. In 2012 they felt a strong calling to share the Gospel with more people and they planted a church in Reynosa called Camino de Fe.

Mario is now the spiritual oversight for the ministry, teachers, staff, and community center and also continues to pastor the Camino de Fe Church. Keila organizes community outreach, ministers to young women and leads a tutoring program in the Aquiles Serdán neighborhood which surrounds the mission. They desire to see a church planted in this same community.
