Prayer of the Church

We share in our health and sickness, happiness and sorrow, assurance and doubt, as we bring our prayers to God, together. Holy Scripture commands elders to pray with and for God's people, not just publicly, but privately.

Scripture Lesson

1 Corinthians 12.1-11 (p. 959)

¹ Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers, I do not want you to be uninformed. ² You know that when you were pagans you were led astray to mute idols, however you were led. ³ Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking in the Spirit of God ever says "Jesus is accursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except in the Holy Spirit.

⁴ Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵ and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; ⁶ and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. ⁷ To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. ⁸ For to one is given through the Spirit the

utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, ⁹ to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, ¹⁰ to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the ability to distinguish between spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. ¹¹ All these are empowered by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills.

SERVING THE BODY

How well do you understand the doctrine of the Trinity? Do you serve the church body? In 1 Corinthians 12 Paul says that we are "the body of Christ and individually members of it" (v. 27). He also says that "God has so composed the body ... that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another" (vv. 24-25). And he says "to each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good" (v. 7). Serving the church body is nothing short of participation in the Trinity. If you want to know and experience a life close to God and close to others, a full-bodied life of selflessness and care, then volunteer to serve your church family. Today we'll begin studying 1 Corinthians 12, while sharing needs in the body, so that we can experience life in the Trinity, together.

CPC MISSIONARY TO THOSE IN PRISON



Mark Casson

In 1989, Mark Casson was sentenced to life in prison with the possibility of parole. Only a few weeks later, Mark was converted to Christ through jail/prison ministry. For the next 15+ years, he would spend his days growing in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. Mark availed himself of the few Bible studies and courses which were available to him, and he spent much of his time in the Word, teaching others, and ministering from the “inside.” In 2004, he was paroled. Mark has continued his active Christian life on the outside. He currently serves as a ruling elder at First Presbyterian Church (PCA). Mark remained active in

prison ministry, and in 2008, he became the executive director of Metanoia Ministries.



Metanoia Ministries is the PCA’s Mission to North America prison ministry arm. At present, Metanoia partners in ministry with over 130 churches nationwide. The discipleship through correspondence ministry has grown to touch more than 1,300 prisoners each year and involves over 500 unique volunteers from reformed churches. The mentoring ministry has also expanded into a total of four facilities across the southeast and plans to expand into several more in the coming years.
