Prayer of the Church

We share in our health and sickness, happiness and sorrow, assurance and doubt, as we bring our prayers to God, together. Holy Scripture commands elders to pray with and for God's people, not just publicly, but privately.

CPC MISSIONARIES IN EAST AFRICA



Daniel & Lydiah Mathuva

Daniel and Lydiah serve with Equipping Leaders International (ELI). Daniel has a passion and call to serve as a church planter and trainer of leaders in his native country. This year, he has been able to help hold Leadership Trainings in Mbale, Uganda, in Tanzania, in Mwanza, Tanzania, and a Marriage Conference in Kilili, Kenya.

Please pray for them and their ministry in these particular ways:

- Continued training toward the certification of 22 church leaders in Mbale, Uganda. Pray that the Lord will help these leaders to finish the course and graduate. Financial inflation has made the cost a burden.
- A looming famine in the Eastern and Northern counties in Kenya; these areas have not received sufficient rains for three years. Many families are going without daily food. The Mathuvas are trying to raise funds to feed some vulnerable families in their home area.
- Kenya is in campaign mode, and elections take place on August 9. Every time there are elections in Kenya, tensions are high, and some areas are volatile and prone to tribal clashes. Pray for peaceful campaigns, elections, and a smooth transition. A peaceful transition means ELI can maintain training in Kenya; without peace no ELI training can go on.

TRINITY CHURCH IN ABERDEEN. SCOTLAND



Trinity Church in Aberdeen, Scotland, is one of our newly supported ministries. Last year, CPC sent Pastor Jones to the UK to participate in the UK Partnership – a coalition of UK and US churches working together to promote church planting in the UK. Upon his return, Pastor John recommended we partner with Trinity Church, which has become a center for training UK church planters. Trinity is remodeling a historic church building in the center of the city

and we have agreed to help support their pastor, David Gibson, for two years so that his salary can be used for work on the building.
