A doxology is a hymn or word of praise to God for His goodness and glory. The *Gloria Patri* is another example of a doxology.

#### Scripture Lesson

We hear and read Holy Scripture throughout the service. Follow along with this text (lesson) that directs the sermon.

- <sup>1</sup> Wisdom has built her house; she has hewn her seven pillars.
- <sup>2</sup> She has slaughtered her beasts; she has mixed her wine; she has also set her table.
- <sup>3</sup> She has sent out her young women to call from the highest places in the town,
- <sup>4</sup> "Whoever is simple, let him turn in here!" To him who lacks sense she says,
- <sup>5</sup> "Come, eat of my bread and drink of the wine I have mixed.
- <sup>6</sup> Leave your simple ways, and live, and walk in the way of insight."
- <sup>7</sup> Whoever corrects a scoffer gets himself abuse, and he who reproves a wicked man incurs injury.
- <sup>8</sup> Do not reprove a scoffer, or he will hate you; reprove a wise man, and he will love you.
- <sup>9</sup> Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be still wiser; teach a righteous man, and he will increase in learning.

## CPC MISSIONARY IN FRANCE AND AFRICA



Jean Baptiste Guéraçaque

Jean serves in France and Africa with Harvestime Ministries. This mission church was originally organized for serving the needs of the Haitian community. In 2001, Harvestime Ministries expanded its reach by supporting the ministry of Jean Baptiste Guéraçaque as a missionary in France and Africa.

In France, a church was established in La Rochelle. In Africa, Jean evangelizes and conducts training seminars for church leaders, primarily in French speaking nations.

He was educated at Moody Bible Institute and Knox Theological Seminary, a Reformed theological seminary. He served as a missionary to the Haitian people

among the boat people in Florida and Haiti for 15 years, before going to France in 2001. He is married to Nicole, and they have six children (three boys and three girls).
