Stepan & Alla are Belarussian nationals who along with their six children serve their neighbors in many ways. Stepan pastors a small church in Belarus, part of the former Soviet Union. Services are conducted on Friday and Sunday. Believers face opposition from the national government, the Russian Orthodox church, and the Roman Catholic church.

Mario and Keila Xoca married in 1996. From 2007-2016, Mario was an IT manager and overseer of four local plants for an automotive company in Reynosa. In 2012 they felt a strong calling to share the Gospel with more people and they planted a church in Reynosa called Camino de Fe.

Mario is now the spiritual oversight for the ministry, teachers, staff, and community center and also continues to pastor the Camino de Fe Church. Keila organizes community outreach, ministers to young women and leads a tutoring program in the Aquiles Serdán neighborhood which surrounds

the mission. They desire to see a church planted in this same community.
