CPC MEDICAL MISSIONARIES IN INDIA

Sujai and Lavanya are doctors who serve with Andhra Pradesh, India. After years of ministry among lepers in India, they responded to God's call to minister to those infected and affected by HIV/AIDS (India's lowest "caste"). Under the Suneethas' dedicated and capable leadership, Nireekshana is dedicated to the compassionate care and support of people living with HIV/AIDS using a holistic approach.

Please pray for them and their expanding ministry in these particular ways:

- For construction on a new clinic and women empowerment and young adults meeting facility. It is anticipated to be finished in Summer 2023.
- For expanding medical care to treat those with diseases associated with poverty (scabies, anemia, malaria, TB, eczema, mycosis, acene, gastrointestinal, stomach infections, skin ulcers, and vitamin deficiencies) in addition to caring for those with AIDS and leprosy.

Paul Billy and Shirley serve with Presbyterian Mission International in South India. God enabled the planting of Bangalore Presbyterian Church in 1994 and Panruti Presbyterian Church in 2003. Teams are being prepared to plant three additional churches. COVID has slowed efforts, as India is greatly affected by the pandemic. Paul Billy and his father teach national pastors and evangelists who have no formal theological training.

Reaching out to the children living on the streets of Bangalore led the Arnolds to open a "drop-in" facility and a home for the children.
