Call to Confession

Frank and Cindy serve with MTW Enterprise. They have worked for more than 20 years in the Muslim ministry. God's Spirit is moving in historically unprecedented ways, churches are being planted and are multiplying. Here is an excerpt from

their most recent update letter: "Trips to four countries were all set with schedules and flights, etc. arranged into mid-December. But then an Ebola outbreak began in one of the countries and in consultation with the others going we decided to postpone, mostly because of the potential that our travel within the country would be disrupted. Then as we were processing a visa for one country we also noticed that our not too old and extra large passport was at the point of being completely out of blank visa pages. We contacted a passport/visa service that could provide rapid processing and found out that we would not have enough time between trips and various applications for other visas to get a new passport and the visas needed for the two countries we planned to visit in December. So once again we had a plan in mind but the Lord seems to have had another direction. All these changes to our plans are, however, good. They are good because the one who directs our steps is Good."
