### Presentation of Tithes & Offerings


We set aside a tithe and additional offering of our resources for the purposes of God, for His glory. Both are a display of our joyful dependence upon God rather than ourselves.



Seventy percent of the remaining languages that need the Bible translated into

their language are orality based. The tools and methods for reaching these tribes and people groups require Christian organizations to work together to share strengths and offer unique innovative solutions that cater to the needs of these challenging languages. They are now being called "The Last Languages."
